Strategic report

The directors present their strategic report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2015.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company during the year was as a debt issuing company on behalf of Manchester Airport Holdings Limited ('the Group'). This is expected to continue for the foreseeable future.

On 16 April 2014, The Company issued a £360.0m publicly listed fixed rate secured bond with a scheduled and legal maturity of 31 March 2024. All proceeds from the issue of the bond (net of certain issuance fees) were used to repay a portion of the Secured Senior Term Facility held elsewhere within the Group.

Business review

The results for the period are set out on page 7. The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend in the year ended 31 March 2015 (2014: £nil).

Principal risks and uncertainties

The key risks faced by the Company are aligned to that of Manchester Airports Holdings Limited. For more details of these risks and how they are managed please refer to the strategic report in the annual report and accounts for Manchester Airports Holdings Limited.

In addition, the Directors believe that the risks that are specific to this company are as follows:-

Non-compliance with Listed Securities requirements

Non-compliance with the Listed Securities requirements could result in sanctions or fines to the business, reputational damage with investors and it could impact the ability to re-finance in the future. The risk is mitigated with an Investor Engagement Plan in place and regular briefings to the Executive Committee undertaken by the Corporate Finance Director.

The key disclosure requirements to ensure compliance with the Disclosure and Transparency Rules ('DTR'), with respect to the appointment and role of the audit committee and the corporate governance disclosures, are included within the Corporate Governance Statement of the Manchester Airport Holdings Limited consolidated group accounts.

The key performance indicators for the Company are aligned to that of Manchester Airports Holdings Limited. Directors' report

Employees

The Company's employment policies are regularly reviewed and updated by the Board.

The Company is committed to providing equality of opportunity to all employees and potential employees. Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements, except as noted below.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom, and under the historical cost accounting rules.

Under FRS 1 the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements.

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Manchester Airports Holdings Limited, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the Group (or investees of the Group qualifying as related parties). The consolidated financial statements of Manchester Airports Holdings Limited, within which this Company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 14.

The Company is able to rely on the Group for financial support. Manchester Airports Holdings Limited has confirmed that it will continue to provide financial and other support to the Company, for at least the next twelve months from the date of approval of the financial statements, to the extent necessary to enable the company to continue to trade and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. The following paragraphs set out a summary of the going concern status of Manchester Airports Holdings Limited.

The Group has considerable financial resources together with long-term contracts with a number of customers and suppliers across different geographic areas and industries. As a consequence, the directors believe that the Group is well placed to manage its business risks successfully despite the current uncertain economic outlook.

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company and the Group have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and financial statements.

The Group's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonably possible changes in trading performance, show that the Group should be able to operate within the level of its current facilities.

Issue costs

Transaction costs directly associated with the bonds are accounted for in accordance with FRS 26 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement. These costs have been initially capitalised, and will be amortised using the effective interest rate method, with the expensing of issue costs forming part of the effective interest rate charge.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

Factors that may affect future current and total tax charges

Reductions in the UK corporation tax rate from 23% to 21% (effective from 1 April 2014) and 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) were substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. In the Budget on 8 July 2015, the Chancellor announced additional planned reductions to 18% by 2020. This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly. The deferred tax balance at 31 March 2015 has been calculated based on the rate of 20% substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

13 Contingent liabilities

Under the Common Terms Agreement signed on 14 February 2014, the Company and a number of its fellow subsidiaries have entered into a security agreement with the Group's bondholders and bankers. The bonds and bank loans are secured by a fixed and floating charge over substantially all of the Group's assets.

14 Ultimate parent company and parent undertaking of larger group of which the company is a member

The Company is a subsidiary undertaking of The Manchester Airport Group PLC. The smallest Group in which the results of the Company are consolidated is that headed by Manchester Airport Group Investments Limited.
